Does the Texas Supreme Court have jurisdiction to decide the constitutionality of the margin tax in an original proceeding?

> "The supreme court has exclusive and original jurisdiction over a challenge to the constitutionality of this Act and may issue injunctive or declaratory relief in connection with the challenge."

H.B. 3, SECTION 24 (79th Leg., 3rd C.S.)

Is the margin tax subject to the Bullock Amendment? And what do we learn?





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Yes: Tax is unconstitutional for margin attributed to natural-person partners. *Beyond that, it depends*





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Yes: Tax is unconstitutional for margin attributed to natural-person partners. *Beyond that, it depends*

No: It depends.

A tax on net income: Not much.

<u>A tax on income of natural persons</u>: A tax on a partnership is or is not a tax on the partners.



Not so fast!



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What is both "a tax on the net incomes of natural persons" and "a person's share of partnership income"?



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What do we learn from the Bullock Amendment issue?

If margin is not income: Not much

<u>If not on natural persons</u>: Tax on partnerships is safe.

If tax on partner's distributive share is tax on partner: Tax on partnerships is subject to referendum.

Does the Margin Tax satisfy the Equal & Uniform Clause?

- Franchise tax is imposed for the privilege of doing business.
- To be equal and uniform, the tax must be commensurate with the value of the privilege.
